Focus On Standards

This School Status and Improvement Report has been prepared as part of the Department's education accountability system to provide regular, understandable accounts of our schools' performance and progress, as required by §302A-1004, Hawai'i Revised Statutes.

This report describes the school and its setting; provides information about the school's administrators, teachers, students and facilities; summarizes progress made based on the school's improvement plan, and reports student achievement results along with other vital signs.

School Description

Anuenue School is geographically set in the back of Palolo Valley above Kaimuki and Waikiki in Honolulu. The main special school program is that it is the DOE's K-12 complex school for the Hawaiian Language Immersion Program on O'ahu.

There are many parent involvement opportunities at the school through the parent organization Na Leo Kako'o. Initially, parent involvement is required to complete a Geographic Exception form to apply for admission to the school.

Anuenue School has an active School Community Council or SCC. The representatives of the six role groups help guide the school.

Because it is a K-12 school, Anuenue is involved in all levels of education- elementary, middle, and high. Specifically, Anuenue is a member of the O'ahu Interscholastic Association or OIA. We have teams in football, volleyball, cheerleading, basketball, canoe paddling, softball, and track and field.

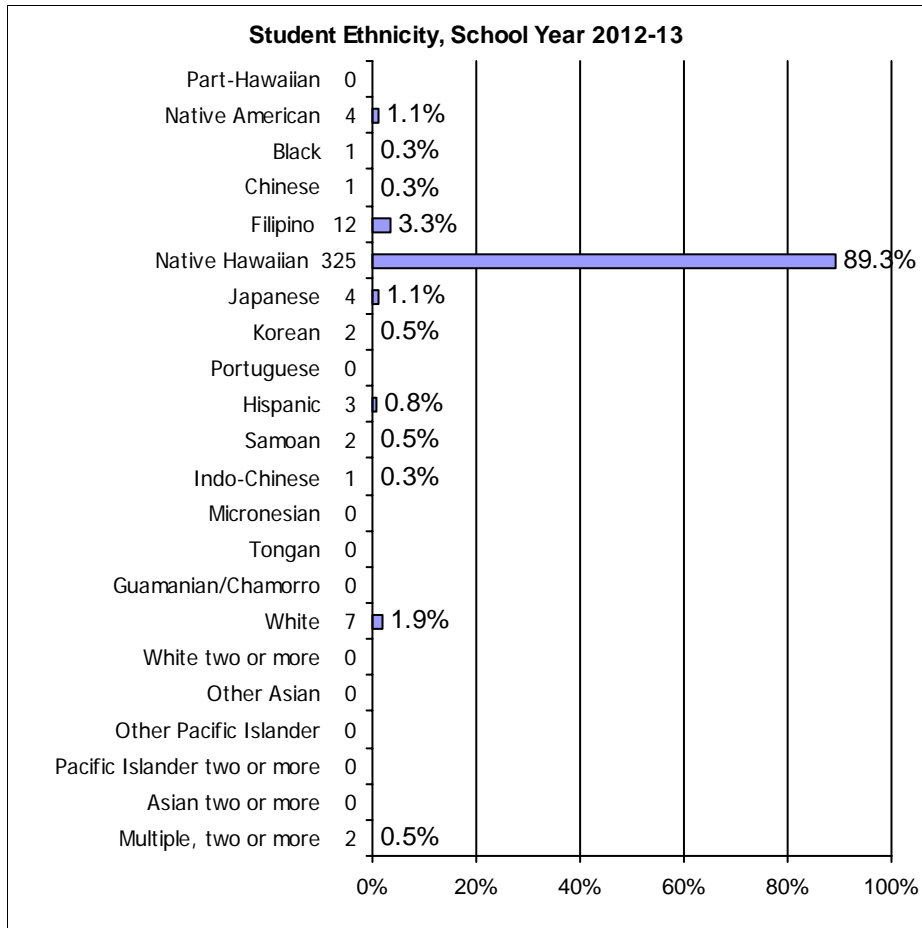
Students are able to gain full education in both Hawaiian and English.

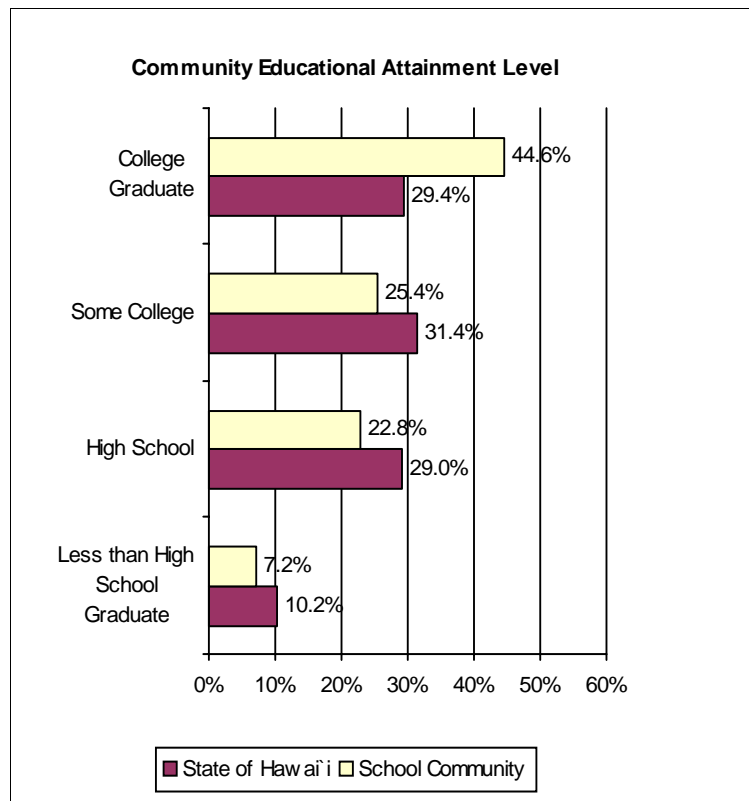
School Setting

School Improvement

Summary of Progress

Anuenue School made progress in the areas of standards implementation and school improvement. It was awarded the Strive HI Award for substantial reading improvement for the past two years. The Strive Hi Award included a reward of \$12,500.

Anuenue was also recognized for making improvements in health, safety, and wellness. There is a new banner hanging in the cafeteria which recognizes the progress made in this area.

Anuenue School also won the HMSA Kaimana Award. The award was for outstanding athletics, sportsmanship, academics and community service. Again, there is a new banner hanging in the cafeteria which recognizes the progress made in the area. The Kaimana Award included a reward of \$1,500.

Anuenue also went through the accreditation process during the past school year. All the indications are that the school made significant progress according to the Focus On Learning or FOL process and indicators.

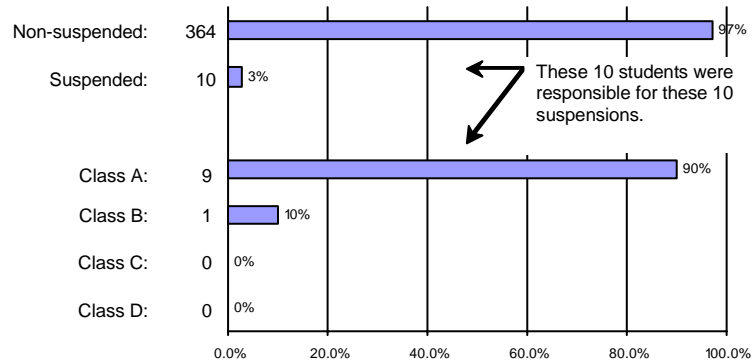

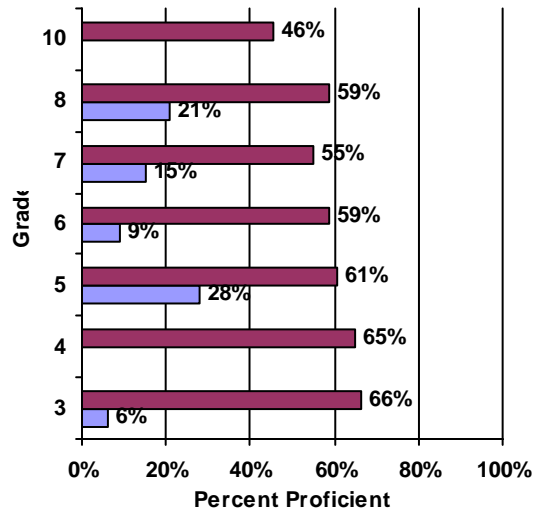

Hawaii State Assessment Program

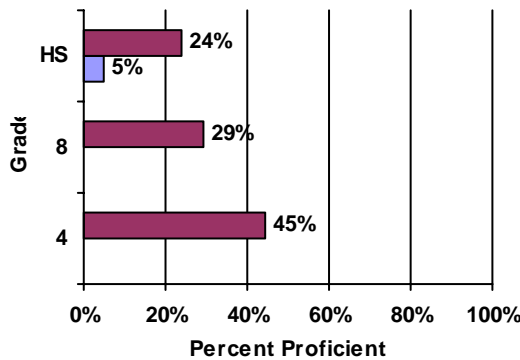
HCPS Reading
